- Maintain an active portfolio of corporate and individual donors and prospects by cultivating meaningful and reciprocal relationships.
- Work collaboratively and maintain open communication with the staff team across all
 functional areas to ensure efficient and positive results including directly supporting and
 advising on stewardship activities led by the Community Engagement Manager.

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- Recruit and inspire volunteers to increase our capacity for fundraising activities including the Campaign Cabinet, affinity groups and other committees.
- Effectively use our CRM (currently Andar) to capture donor data, plan and monitor fundraising effectiveness.
- Set up appropriate monitoring mechanisms that ensure continued success and effectiveness of initiatives.

- Foster a workplace environment that is inclusive, productive and where every team member feels welcomed, proud to be on our team and enjoys coming to work.

- Ability to multi-task and pay attention to detail, accuracy, timelines and quality of work at all times.
